FROM THE PASTOR

You can't blame the chickens - they didn't know!

In medieval Europe, the church of Rome had strict rules for fasting during Lent. No meat or any animal product, including eggs, was to be consumed. As I said, the chickens didn't know, and they kept producing eggs. Rather than discarding the eggs, they boiled them and

saved them for when Lent ended on Easter. At some point in history, they started coloring them for Easter celebrations.

Paas comes from Pasen, the Dutch word for Easter. William Townley, a New Jersey drugstore owner, invented concentrated dye tablets in 1893. He had a good idea!

Some believe that hiding Easter eggs started with Martin Luther and others who were part of the Reformation. Men would hide the eggs around the church property, and woman and children would hunt for them. This was to symbolize the women who first discovered the empty tomb.

The egg and the Easter bunny have their root in the thought of fertility, and the celebration of the goddess Eostre. Yes, that is where we get the name for Easter!!

The painting by Italian artist Titian in 1530 called The Madonna of the Rabbit hangs in the Louvre in Paris. It was thought at one time that the rabbit could reproduce without having a male rabbit involved. Over time, the rabbit became an allusion to the Virgin's conception of Christ.



As Christianity moved from place to place, the missionaries would connect pagan celebrations with that of the Christians. In springtime, we see many bunnies — they just appear and then disappear to wherever! This, in a way, became a symbol for Christ; after His resurrection and before His ascension, Jesus would appear to His followers and then disappear. You can see why the bunny became associated with Christ!

his Easter, keep an eye out for a bunny – they appear and then disappear. When you observe this, think of Jesus and His victory over death, and how He appeared to many following His Resurrection.

The Lord Has Risen! He has Risen Indeed! Happy Easter!

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

Give Generously, and You Will Never Lack

Our Father in heaven sent His Son, Jesus, to be our Savior. His atoning sacrifice is the first fruits of all the dead, a pleasing aroma to His Father, so that His perfect life and death count for all who believe in Him. He claimed us as His own children in Holy Baptism. He sustains and strengthens our faith with His Holy Word and His Body and Blood.

As new creatures, who have put on Christ, we bear good fruit. We do the good works prepared for us, which He makes known to us in His Word. By faith then, trusting in the Word of God, we do what he says because He does not lie and always keeps His promises. For "without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him" (Hebrews 11:6).

And so the Lord promises: "Honor the Lord with your wealth and with the first fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be bursting with wine" (Proverbs 3:9-10). How do we honor the Lord with the wealth that God has given us in His generosity? By giving generously to those whom the Lord has called us to love and support your family, your society, and your church. And His promise is that, in so doing, you will never lack.

A common counterpoint is: "But that's from the Old Testament!" Our Lord Jesus Himself gives us similar promises in the New Testament. He says, at the conclusion of the parable of the talents: "For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance" (Matthew 25:29).

And then at the end of the parable of the dishonest manager, he says: "One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. If then you have not been faithful in the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful in that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money" (Luke 16:10–13).

And in His sermon on the mount, he says: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matt. 6:19–21).

We have become conditioned against these promises because of their misuse by the peddlers of the prosperity gospel - the guys on TV who say you get rich by putting God in your debt. And thus, we miss out on the fact that God

does reward temporal faithfulness in temporal matters with temporal blessings. It's no quid pro quo. It's all from God's grace and His fatherly divine goodness and mercy. But those Bible passages do in fact say what they say! It's not the Old Testament's problem. It's ours. It is almost as if we have become so jaded against this that we think it a virtue to be stingy with our offerings.

But our Father in heaven still loves to bless those who bless others. He loves to give to those who give freely and generously. In fact, he challenges us to challenge Him: "Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need" (Malachi 3:10).


And so, while we don't give so that we would get, we do receive from the Lord in order to give, and He will bless your giving with more receiving. As St. Paul wrote in *Romans 8:32*: "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?"

KOST OF KAMP

In 1977, Kid Kat Kamp had 44 campers. The program budget was \$5,013, with 81% of the cost going directly to Camp Skyline. The budget also included one campership (scholarship), \$10 for curriculum material, \$100 for safety training and supplies, and \$400 total for salaries for four administrative staff and ten counselors. Program costs were partially covered by a fundraiser selling garbage bags, which raised \$359!



POUR OUT TO THE GOD OF HOPE AND BE FILLED

"Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13

The annual National Day of Prayer will be held on **Thursday, May 1st**, inviting people to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. Our Task Force is a privately funded organization whose purpose is to encourage participation on the National Day of Prayer. It exists to communicate with every individual the need for personal repentance and prayer, to create appropriate materials, and to mobilize the Christian community to intercede for America's leaders and its families. The Task Force represents a expression Judeo-Christian of the national observance, based on our understanding that this country was birthed in prayer and in reverence for the God of the Bible.

MOUNT EVEREST TRAGEDY A TIME TO LIVE...A TIME TO DIE

May 10, 1996 is the date of the most historic tragedy in Mt. Everest history. Eight climbers died. Lou Kasischke, A Redeemer member and renowned mountain climber, was there. He lived to tell that story!

The setting is climbing the highest mountain in the world. The drama was high when, after six-weeks of climbing, things went wrong near the summit. At this point, Lou was 400 vertical feet from the top, but the crux of his story has much in common with everyday life. This was Lou's struggle with himself when he faced a tough decision and conflicting internal voices about what to do. Lou's story includes uncommon moments that revealed what saved his life. It's a story about the still, small voice of the heart. It's really a love story.

Lou will join us at Redeemer on Sunday afternoon, May 4th at 6:00pm in the Sanctuary to show images and tell his intriguing and moving personal story which is more about being mountainside. It's also about his long aftermath journey to understand his experience, to find meaning in it, to share the role of his Christian faith in his survival, and to serve as an example of how and where to go for the guidance and inner strength needed in hard decision moments.

Lou wrote a book entitled "After the Wind" about his experience and served as a consultant to Universal Pictures for the 2015 feature film, "Everest," that told the tragic





REDEEMER YOUTH OVER THE YEARS

Our emphasis on Youth has always been at the pinnacle of Redeemer's focus and ministry. From fellowship, Bible studies, and mission work, the bond between participants has always been strong, due in large part to our exceptional leaders.

In 1940-1941, Redeemer joined both the LCMS National Youth Group and the International Walther League. Lots of activities followed, such as a Variety Show in 1961, where our own Ginny Schalm performed. The youth held a Toy Drive each year, collecting and repairing toys for St. Andrews in Detroit, and an onsite 2-week VBS, teaching children of Riverside Church in Detroit.

By 1965, the Walther League was renamed "Youth Group," and mission projects were locally centered with visits to nursing homes and the Pontiac State Hospital. H. William (Bill) Meinert was hired in 1966 as our Director of Christian Education. Under his direction, the Youth Group flourished. Mr. "M" took the kids on retreats in the fall and winter to Camp Skyline. The retreats offered Bible studies, singing, and spiritual activities. Beth Lanthier remembers fondly how, "Mr. M taught us so much about ourselves and God's love." Overnight Lock- Ins at the church were a popular highlight, as well.

In 1969, our youth began the "Mums for Moms" project for Mother's Day. Mums beautifully decorated the Sanctuary and were purchased by people wishing to honor their living mothers or those dearly remembered. The youth also participated in a "Hike for the Hungry" where they received pledges for each mile walked, which totaled 20-miles, raising \$1,765.00 with a bonus of lots of sore feet!



An annual charitable project in the 1970s was "Take a Kid Shopping," where our youth took groups of underprivileged kids to a local mall to help them buy Christmas gifts.

Camp Skyline was the original home for our Kampers. Looking at the Kamp Kommittee roster today, you will find all former kampers and kounselors! Kamp fundraisers sold M&M's and trash bags, and held spaghetti dinners and pancake breakfasts. We held Bible studies, and we sang and worshipped in the Chapel in the Woods. A high point of the week was the hike to the graveyard and hearing the scary story of "Yellow Mike," which Kevin Jones created. Most popular was the "dance" - most of the boys would finally shower on the day of the dance! - and we were allowed to 'slow dance' to "Stairway to Heaven," and later to the beat of 50s music.



JoAnn Tylicki took over as Youth Group leader in 1977, when Mr. M felt that he needed someone younger to lead the youth. She was a "regular" in Youth Group, and under her direction, the group continued to thrive. Two major events took place annually - a "Special Kids" party and a Dance Marathon for Muscular Dystrophy. Kevin Jones' band would play in the gym, and there were events like goldfish swallowing and throwing a pie in Pastor Duane's face! Oh no!

By 1987, JoAnn needed to devote her time to school and work, and Pastor Toby Joeckel was hired as the Minister of Bible Study and Youth. Under his leadership, the youth went on white water rafting trips and excursions to the Torch Lake home of long-time Redeemer members Kathy and John Ostrander. In 1991, Pastor Toby moved, and Joe Werner was hired as the Minister of Children and Family Life.

In 1996, the opportunity arose for our youth to go to Mexicali and join 2,000 other youth from the US in Spring Break mission work. They lived in tents, with no showers or flushing toilets, and brushed their teeth in "spit holes." In 1998, the Youth Group returned to Mexicali and the village of Irapuato to restore a church. These mission trips really showcased the meaning of service to others. Donna Hollis, a long-time chaperone wrote in 1999, "Our 4 years in Irapuerto has helped us develop a solid, trusting relationship with its Pastor. He told us our presence has been an answer to many prayers. About 125 children attend the daily VBS activities - Bible lessons, singing, crafts, and games. Our youth also described Christian family values to the village women. Both the people of Irapuato and our youth exchanged valuable blessings reaching far into the future."

In 2016, after it was deemed too dangerous to travel to Mexicali, our youth explored other Spring Break mission work opportunities. They ventured to Jamaica to work with physically and developmentally disabled children and adults. North Carolina needed ramps built for the disabled, and our youth answered the call. They traveled to New Orleans to "muck out" debris from several hurricanes, and in Puerto Rico, painted the exterior and playground of a school, and also helped teachers in Spanish and English classes. Redeemer's youth have engaged in relational ministry, children's ministry, and physical labor for many years.

100TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

In 2000, Joe Werner took a call elsewhere and Mark Wuggazer, another "born and raised at Redeemer," took over as Youth Director. He continued the Mexicali tradition and saw the numbers of youth on the Mission Team soar. Of the many legacies Mark left, the Mexicali Mission trips, "Heart of Worship," and the contemporary worship service "Redemption" left a beautiful spiritual presence at Redeemer.

Many former Youth Group members continue to lead the youth. Mark Bushuiakovish took over when Wuggie was at Seminary, Laura Vowell and Joel Brockberg started our JAMS group, and Eric Wisniewski and Gia Scheidt lead our senior high youth.



Kid Kat Kamp is now held at Michawana, and former Kamp Kounselor, now Director, Tim Springer has kept this ministry alive. Peter Neumann, a well-known Christian singer/songwriter continues to join the group at Kamp and leads the worship.

Today, the youth continue to have an impact on Redeemer through Spring Break mission trips, helping with our Rummage Sale, and volunteering at the Family of God Soup Kitchen.





COUNSELING CORNER

A few days ago, a member of Redeemer stopped by my office when the door was open, and he noted the three scriptures that I have painted on my wall by an artist. He and his wife were admiring these scriptures, and I told them that these three scriptures are what I have learned to live my life by, and I've realized that I also constantly refer to them during my counseling sessions. They have literally changed my life and paradigm in challenging times.

In contemplating what to share with you this month, these same scriptures came to mind, and I would like to share them with you, too...

Colossians 3:23: "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving."

Lesson Learned: The person God expects you to serve (spouse, friend, co-workers, relative, parent, etc.) sometimes does NOT deserve anything from you, much less service! (Neither did we, but Jesus died for us anyway, out of LOVE!) However - here's the gold! - when you serve them, you are doing it as unto the Lord - you are serving HIM! With this paradigm shift, it is a whole lot easier to serve others who, in our flesh, don't deserve it! We are to be a living sacrifice (Romans 12:1) - this truly is walking the talk!

Habakkuk 3:17-19: "Though the fig tree does not bud and there are no grapes on the vines, though the olive crop fails and the fields produce no food, though there are no sheep in the pen and no cattle in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior. The Sovereign Lord is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, he enables me to tread on the heights."

Lesson Learned: No matter how bad or tough life gets, I will keep praising the Lord no matter what the circumstances look like! God's got this, and He has a plan to help me. I will not give in to negativity (Satan's playground) - God ALWAYS comes through for me. It does not matter how things "look" - it's a faith-walk, for sure.

Proverbs 3:5-7: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean NOT on your own understanding; in ALL your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

Lesson Learned: I'm still learning to give EVERYTHING to God that concerns me. My kneejerk response is to handle things on my own and not "bother the Lord with the small stuff." But, it sure goes a whole lot better when I trust God with everything. You'll see!

I truly pray you give these scriptures a try - they are life-changing! Be more contemplative and more intentional. Did you know that the things (good and bad) you obsess about and ruminate on are the very things that can start to take root in your heart? That's why God instructs us to "meditate on His Word day AND night and obey everything in it - then you will prosper and succeed in all you do" (Joshua 1:8). God's Word has transformative power to change your life!

May the Lord empower you on your journey with Him!


