**As We Gather**

Prayer is hard. We get distracted. We don't know how. We feel unprepared. Then we feel guilty for not praying, but we don't know where or how to start. Sometimes, we don't even know why we pray if God is going to just do his work anyway. Today, we meet the disciples that were in the same situation. They asked Jesus how to pray! Jesus does not disappoint them, or us! He tells them an exact prayer. He even tells them where and why to pray. Remember, prayer is what Christian's do because they are filled with the Holy Spirit and are a new creation. As children of the heavenly Father, we pray through Jesus because He commands us to pray and promises to hear us.

**Prayer Before Worship**

Our Father in heaven, make us holy by Your name through Your Word of Law that tells us of our sin, and Gospel that promises us Your Son and all of His gifts. Please send your Holy Spirit so that by your grace we believe your word and live holy lives. Please let your will be done among us by stopping the devil, the world and our sinful nature from carrying out their evil purposes. Please provide us with all that we need for this body and life. Please forgive our sins by covering them in the blood of Christ and help us to forgive others in the same way. Please do not let us be tempted, but guard us from all temptation of false belief and vice. Finally, dear Father in heaven, please rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and reputation. Give us a blessed death, and bring us into eternal life. We know that these are your promises because you have taught us to pray in this way and to hear us. Let all these things happen for us. In Jesus’ name, Amen.







### WOMEN'S BOOK GROUP

Women's Book Group meets on **Tuesday, May 27** at 7:30pm to review ***Red Scarf Girl: A Memoir of the Cultural Revolution*** by Li-Ji Jiang. This is NOT a book about the "big picture" of what happened in Communist China during the Cultural Revolution. Rather, it is a memoir of the lives of a young girl and her family and her friends' families. For the Chinese people, society's rules about what is good and bad were reversed, first when the Communists conquered China in 1949, and then the reversal was emphasized seventeen years later, when the Cultural Revolution began. The result was that families who, before Communism, had worked hard and intelligently and had prospered suddenly became national enemies. Even those who had chosen not to flee China, out of a strong sense of Chinese patriotism, like the author's parents and grandparents, were declared by the state to be "enemies of the people". Even worse, no way was allowed for such a family to "make up" for its past, and even the children who were born into Communism, like the author and her siblings and friends, were declared to be guilty of the "crimes" of their ancestors. Agonizing choices, sacrifice, fear and reprisal underscore this story of passage. We will be waiting for you in the Town Square.


