As We Gather

Then, in the same service, Jesus gives His true, real, physical body and blood to us in, with and under the bread and wine. When you eat this bread and drink this wine, you eat and drink the body and blood of Christ. This is true communion with Christ and it is communion with one another as the body of Christ. This is why we must confess together what we believe we receive when we go forward for the Lord’s Supper.

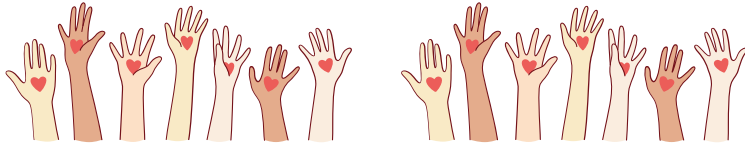

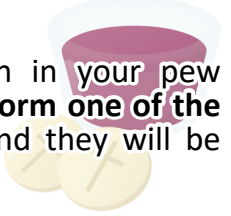
