### As We Gather

Jesus rides into Jerusalem on the back of a lowly donkey to the cries of "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" (John 12). He comes to the people in gentle humility, yet also as the King of Israel. His royal glory is faithful obedience and self-sacrificing service to the point of death, even death on a cross. God's love is manifested in the cross and Passion of His Son for the salvation of sinners. Jesus willingly subjected Himself to all forms of mistreatment, yet in and through it all He trusted in His Father who raised Him from death and the grave and exalted the Lord to His right hand. This same Jesus now comes to us in gentle humility by means of His holy Word, where He cleanses and covers us with His sacrificial blood. May the blessing of His presence in our worship today fill us with joy, strength and peace as we follow His journey to the Cross and the empty tomb.

### Lenten Observance

As part of our Lenten observance, we follow the old church custom of omitting the "Alleluias" from our worship, symbolizing our voluntary restraint of praise during the penitential season of Lent.

### Prayer Before Worship

The King comes. In this strange mixture of triumph and impending tragedy, on this Sunday of the Palms, we see from the vantage of the passing years not what the shouting crowds supposed nor what the active agents of the Passion quite intended. But we discern what heaven wrought: the King comes to shouts and singing and acclaim: (Prayer) We wish, dear Lord, just once to let our inhibitions go and offer You our homage with happy abandon. A palm branch, a coat, anything that we can lay our hands on to strew before You in Your path, to spread before Your feet, and ourselves to kneel down in devotion and adore You, this is our purpose. For You are King of all the people. In royal beauty bright and in ugly, gory shame, You are the Sovereign who saves and leads His people. You are our Prince of peace. Your loyal followers walk in the train of one who conquers all our enemies and provides for all our needs. In Your Name we pray, Amen.






