CARING FOR MY NEIGHBOR

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but *help* and support him in every physical need" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us. We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need

the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.

Love your neighbor as yourself.

Ambassador Desta Getinet Demeke Interest: Sheep fattening; Start-up Business Amount: \$250



- Married & is living with her husband.
- Desta has had three pregnancies in her lifetime, with the first being at age 25. She was in labor for 24 hours at home the first time she gave birth, which resulted in a stillborn. She began having difficulty controlling urine five days later. She suffered from urine incontinence for one year without treatment.
- Quote: "Before I got treatment I was staying at home because my neighbors were laughing at me and holding their nose while they saw me, but after treatment I was fully cured and I was very happy. Now fistula happened [to] me again. I hope my wound will heal in the future".
- One year later she developed difficulty of controlling her urine so she went to hospital and then was referred to Addis Ababa and underwent repair surgery, but she was not fully cured. Two years after she developed fistula she went to Hamlin Fistula Ethiopia Bahir Dar Centre for a second successful surgery. Unfortunately, her third childbirth was attempted at home with the same results as her first childbirth: she labored for 24 hours and was left with another stillborn child, and another case of obstetric fistula.

Updates on her IGA (income generating Activity): We bought her three sheep for fattening. She said "I sold three of them for birr 13,000 for the Ethiopian new year holy day and then I bought another four sheep for fattening. I have birr 3,000 saved in my personal bank account. I bought new



clothes for myself and for my husband from the profit. I also can contribute some money for community events during some social celebration and I started attending any activity in my village, I am very happy now, I have some money in my hand because of HHOJ's support. My husband is helping me and is contributing to my success."

New in the Redeemer library for youngsters of all ages:

Wherever You Go, I Want You to Know by Melissa Kruger with illustrations by Isobel Lundy. Children dream, pretend, and talk about what they want to do as they grow up, where they'll go, and who they might meet. In this clever, rhyming, and colorfully illustrated book geared for ages 3-6, author Melissa teaches children that the most important decision in their life is to follow Jesus. I've spent a large portion of my counseling career helping people be more comfortable in their own skin, the way God wired them. For example, an introvert who tries to live up to the false expectations of their peers so they pretend to be someone they are not like putting on more of a happy face, attending events with lots of conversation that can be draining. This kind of self- inflicted pressure can manifest into anxiety attacks. It is exhausting, I am told.

I'm not saying if you are lonely and a bit of a loner to just stay at home and do nothing...but how about lowering the bar on yourself just a bit and find a happy medium where you can be with others, but on your terms? A book club, attending a guest lecturer at the local library or university etc. You get the picture. Putting on a false persona and being inauthentic can be and is usually exhausting.

It can be extremely helpful to examine the phrase "Like likes like". In other words, hang out with others who are wired like you are. If you are the more quiet type, find events that would attract those like yourself and attend. Remember, God made you the way you are, wired you the way you are. So, if someone does not like the way you are wired and they try to change you tell them to take it up with your Maker. God said He knew you before you were born. "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before I set you apart; I appointed you prophet to the nations Jeremiah 11. He already has a plan for your life before you are born. He knew exactly who and what He was creating before you came into existence. He loves you just the way he made you.

Being authentically You and comfortable with who you are, can be very freeing and once practiced enough by using your voice to refute the critics, I bet there will be a decrease in the anxiety. Check yourself as you are learning to use your voice more and not be embarrassed of who God made you to be. See if some of the bothersome symptoms begin to disappear.

Finally, may I encourage you not to allow others to thwart God's plan for your life just because they don't like or understand who you (in Christ!) are, so they try to change you! New set of friends? Maybe more like yourself? Remember, YOU are in control of your friend choices.

If you are dating someone that you just can't seem to change, I would suggest accept who they are as God made them or move on to someone who will be better suited for you without all of the undue pressure to both of you trying to change them into someone they are not.

In this month that celebrates Love, show love and kindness to yourself. God loves you SO much. Believe it. Embrace it. Live it!!
