Dear Friends in Christ,
 Christmas was so special as we worshiped and celebrated the birth of Christ for the second time in our beautiful new Sanctuary. As I shared with you on Christmas Eve, a story and tradition of La



Befana, I would like to re-share it for our message of the New Year.

Legend has it that on the 12th night of Christmas the Wise Men, on search for the baby Jesus, came to La Befana's home and asked for directions to the location of the Christ child. She did not know how to get there, but the Wise Men invited her to travel with them. She at first declined, stating she had too much housework as they could see from the broom in her hand. Later that night she saw the star that the Wise Men had talked about and were following and she regretted her decision. She left looking for the Wise Men, but could not find them.

She went home and picked up the broom that cost her everything. She wept and her tears fell upon the broom, giving the broom special power to fly. It is believed that on every 12th night she goes out looking for the Wise Men and the baby Jesus. She travels with gifts and as she makes her journey, stops at the home of children to bring them gifts; good gifts for good children and not so good gifts for the naughty.

I know it's only a tradition, but a sad one at that. She is forever lost, never being able to find what she did not want in the first place. Forever searching, paying the price for a bad decision. Sometimes our lives can feel like that of La Befana, forever searching, but never finding, forever regretting and never having another opportunity.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

The Chief Stewards of Humanity: Mom and Dad

St. Paul tells the Ephesians that the first commandment with a specific promise attached to it is, "Honor your father and mother so that it may go well with you, and you may live long in the land" (Eph. 6:2). This promise is one indication of the importance of this commandment. The other thing that highlights the special nature of this commandment is its placement within the Ten Commandments.



The Ten Commandments are clearly organized in two big categories. The first three commandments deal with our relationship with God. This category is called the First Table of the Law. The last seven commandments, the Second Table of the Law, tell us how we should relate to other people. These two tables correspond to what Jesus calls the two greatest commandments: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind," and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matt. 22:37-39).

The order of the Second Table of the Law is also important. Murder is a greater sin than adultery, which is a greater sin than stealing, or lying, or coveting. But why is the Fourth Commandment first in the Second Table, ahead of "you shall not murder"? Is disobeying your parents really worse than murder? Or maybe we should give up on thinking these commandments are ordered?

The overall effect of this order is to get us to see our parents as a connection point between our neighbors and our God. Throughout our upbringing our father and mother stand between us and God and deliver

His gifts to us: God clothes us, feeds us, protects us and teaches His Word to us through our parents.

So, parents have a very high calling from God. They are called to be stewards of the greatest gift: the gift of life.

Parenting thus gives us a keen insight into all our stewardship. Parents know that they have been given a great treasure in their children, a treasure that does not belong to them, yet for which they feel a great deal of responsibility. Truth be told, every gift we have been given is like this, because everything we have — whether our own personal skills and powers or our wealth and time — is all from God. He entrusts it all to us so that we can use it all and take care of it all for His great purposes.



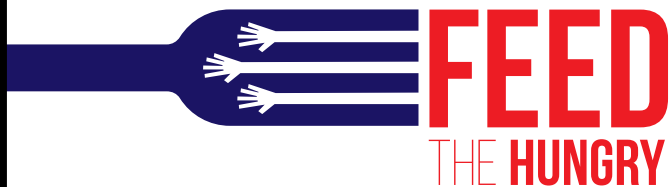

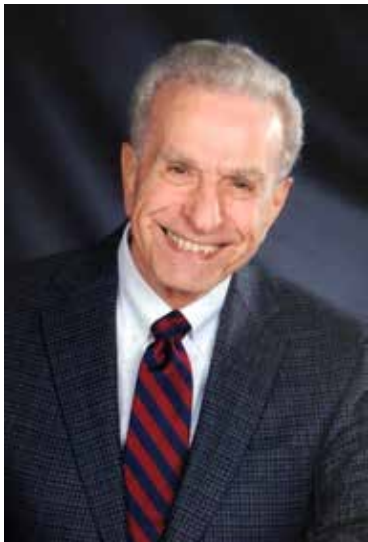


MEN'S MINISTRY

LIBRARY LIGHTS

Happy New Year 2024! Can you believe it? Another year gone and a new one beginning. Any year comes with blessings, hardships, delights, challenges, and expectations. How will you see God in your life this coming year? As we think about God's faithfulness which is complete and everlasting, ponder how we each may grow in our own faithfulness by what we read and study.

NEW IN THE LIBRARY:

Praying the Names of God for 52 Weeks by Ann Spangler. Grow in intimacy and understanding of God as you study how He is named in the Bible. In ancient times titles meant a lot. English readers are not always able to fully understand God's qualities without knowing the original language, whether Hebrew, Aramaic or Greek. Author Spangler reveals God's essence and character by revealing His names and their meanings, from God Almighty (El Shaddai), Lord (Adonai), and Father (Abba), to Emmanuel, Prince of Peace, Yeshua and more.

Arlo and the Great Big Cover-up by Betsy Childs Howard. Arlo has been a naughty boy. He did something during his rest time that he knew was wrong but did it anyway. He attempts to cover up his disobedience before his mom finds out. Uh oh! Mom finds out anyway and Arlo must face his sin, his attempts to hide it and learns the freedom forgiveness when he confesses. (ages 3-7).

Counseling Corner

The New Year is here and I might say, 2023 was a very difficult year on so many fronts. Suffice it to say, glad it's over and I'm looking forward to what the Lord has in store for us in this coming year. Worth repeating, is something that I have found to be a game changer for yearly expectations. I make a list every New Years Eve of prayer requests that I would like to petition our Lord to work on and provide closure to, in the forthcoming new year.

I base this practice on the Scripture Philippians 4:6-7 "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God" So, I write them out with lots of gratitude and acknowledgement of the things He did for me in the past year. Gratitude is underrated. So, I would counsel us all to step it up a bit with the gratitude towards God and the things He has done. As the Psalmist says "Let everything that hath breath Praise the Lord!" (Psalm 156:6) If you don't know how to start, just Praise Him!

I then pull out my list from last year and write down the answers to my petitioned requests with God. He is so faithful I am over whelmed by His tender care and answers even when some are still in the "wait" mode. This is a true exercise of walking in faith and can ease one's anxiety about the future. For the most part, anxiety is fear of what will happen in the future. What a comfort and privilege to be able to "give it all to God", and watch Him work.

In going to God in prayer not too long ago, I asked Him about a situation that was troubling me. I felt Him say to me, "Pray. Wait." When I pressed Him for more information all He said in closing was "Believe". So, Pray. Wait. Believe. "Believe" is the secret sauce to getting prayers answered. If we keep waiting, believing in expectation, expecting God to act in some way, then that act of faith motivates Him to act on our behalf. Just like what Jesus did when He was approached by a man in a crowd for help, Jesus told him to just believe and he replied "I do believe, help me in my unbelief." (Mark 9:23-24)

So, in closing, why not change the trajectory of your prayer life this coming year with more written out petitions and gratitude and believing that God WILL help you. Give Him your fears and trust Him to help you (Proverbs 3:5-7). See if that does not in some way reduce your anxiety. Be consistent, be intentional. FYI, reduction in caffeine intake (coffee, pop, tea) is another anxiety reducer!

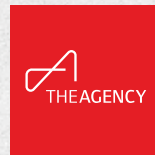

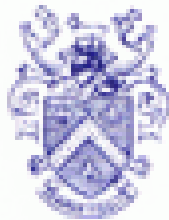
