"Don't you think fathers deserve a place in the sun, too?" -Sonora Smart Dodd

In 1972, President Richard Nixon's administration declared the third Sunday in June a day to honor the role of fathers in society. Mother's Day was first recognized in 1914. Why did it take so long to make it official?



American historian Timothy Marr wrote in American Masculinities: A Historical Encyclopedia that in the holiday's early decades, men "scoffed at the holiday's sentimental attempts to domesticate manliness with flowers and gift-giving, or they derided the proliferation of such holidays as a commercial gimmick to sell more products - often paid for by the father himself."

In 1909, Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington was inspired by Mother's Day and said the above quote. She was 27-years old when she came up with the idea. She eventually convinced the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA to set aside a day for fathers. She proposed June 5 in memory of her father's birthday, but the ministers chose the third Sunday in June. On June 19, 1901 the first Father's Day was celebrated.

Sonora's dad, William Jackson Smart, inspired her also. He was a farmer and Civil War veteran, and a single parent, after his wife Ellen died giving birth to their youngest child in 1898. He would raise Sonora and her five brothers. Sonora finally got to see this holiday become a national holiday when Congress approved it in 1972; she was 90 years old at this time. She would die 6-years later. We have Sonora and the memory of her father to thank for this special day.

"Listen to your father, who gave you life, and do not despise your mother when she is old. Buy the truth and do not sell it - wisdom, instruction and insight as well. The father of a righteous child has great joy; a man who fathers a wise son rejoices in him." - Proverbs 23:22-24

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

Rooted in Christ, Growing in Stewardship

The heartland is now awash in various hues of green. The doldrums of winter give way to the colors of spring. Now, the promise of spring gives way to the growth of summer. Fields are planted and sprouted. Gardens are planted. Flowers adorn the beds of neighborhood homes and roadside ditches. Green is the shade of life!

Green growth is also the hue of the faithful steward. The seed of faith planted in human hearts in the waters of Holy Baptism grows as it is nurtured in the Word proclaimed and ingested in the Holy Supper. This faith does indeed save. But our stewardship of the Gospel is also designed to bear fruit for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor.

To consider this, let us look at the hymn, "Fruitful Trees, the Spirits Sowing" (LSB 691). It is very much a stewardship hymn!

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's sowing, May we ripen and increase, Fruit to life eternal growing, rich in love and joy and peace.

- The tree of faith is not planted in us by us. It is the Spirit's work! We do not claim the title "steward." Rather, we are created for it (Genesis 1:26–28).
- He is the One who makes it grow in us. The fruits of the Spirit are borne out because we, by grace through faith, are connected to the vine that is Jesus (John 15).

Laden branches freely bearing Gifts the Giver loves to bless; Here is fruit that grows by sharing, Patience, kindness, gentleness.

- Our stewardship is NOT about what we do. It is about what the Holy Spirit does in and through us. That is the fruit that we bear. His fruit for His purposes.
- But that fruit is lived out through us. The world sees the fruit of our stewardship of the Gospel in lives lived connected to Word and Sacrament.

Rooted deep in Christ our Master, Christ our pattern and our goal, Teach us, as the years fly faster, Goodness, faith, and self-control.

- Stewards have been created and redeemed to reflect the image of Jesus in the world. He is the pattern. We reflect to others around us the Light of the Gospel He has shone on us.
- This reflection comes when Christ's goodness flows from us to others.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's tending, May we grow till harvests cease; Till we taste, in life unending, Heaven's love and joy and peace.

- Just as the Spirit has created us for stewardship of the Gospel, so also does He cause our faithfulness! He calls, gathers, enlightens, sanctifies and KEEPS us in this faithful stewardship of the Gospel.
- The ultimate goal of our faithful stewardship is eternity. For us. For our neighbor. All worked out by the Spirit.

Green is the color of the world right now. It is also the color of our stewardship and it is growing in us as we are connected to the vine, Jesus! God grant our growth in Him!

In the Children's section we have a wonderful **DVD series called "What's in the Bible?" by Phil Vischer**, creator of VeggieTales. This wonderful 13 DVD series explains the tough questions like, "Who wrote the Bible? Why do we call it Christmas? What is faith?" With a creative mix of puppets, animation, and live action, this series will answer all those gnawing questions your kids (and you!) have always had about the Bible, who is in it, and why.

Our library also offers many helpful books and Bible studies for parents. Raising children in the digital age has many challenges, especially during the months of summer when kids have an abundance of free time. This book will help you recognize the signs of too much screen time in your kids, as well as how to create safe boundaries around screen time, accessing the on-line community, and social media.

School may be out for the summer, but this is the perfect time to learn something new! Our library has an abundance of devotional books and Bible studies in print as well as on DVD. One amazing DVD Bible study series is titled That The World May Know by Ray Vander Laan. This Bible study series has more than a dozen different volumes that each feature a video and study guide that are divided up into 5 different segments to dig deeper into the Bible. Ray Vander Laan's unique hands-on explanation literally takes you into the Holy Land as he shares biblical ideas and explains the history and life of those we've read about.







FROM GENERATION TO GENERATION: REDEEMER'S PASTORAL MINISTRY OVER THE YEARS

"One generation commends your works to another; they tell of your mighty acts." - Psalm 145:4

It's not often in a church's history that only 3 senior pastors can claim 94-years of its 100-year history. But Lutheran Church of the Redeemer proudly owns this faithful distinction.

The first origins of Redeemer began in 1924 when Pastor Luther Schuessler was assigned by the Michigan District Synod to canvass the young, rural town of Birmingham as a viable area for a new Lutheran church. By November 1924, he deemed there was indeed a need, and the first worship service of Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church was held at Johnson-Shaw Hall on South Old Woodward. By May of 1925, we forged a new home not far away with a Chapel on Ann Street. Less than one year later in 1926, Pastor Scheussler took a new call, but we are forever grateful to God for this pastor's perseverance and forethought in making Redeemer not only an aspiration but truly a reality.

Reverend Ronald Scaer accepted Redeemer's call in 1926, setting his sights on growing the congregation. As Pastor Duane wrote upon our 50th Anniversary, "It takes a strong faith to start a church. And it takes a strong faith to sustain a church." The Lord saw the strength of Pastor Scaer's faith, and soon our congregation began to increase and flourish. When Reverend Scaer accepted another call in 1930, Reverend Theodore Wuggazer accepted our call to become Redeemer's third pastor.

As many would say, "The Wuggazer Dynasty" now began. Pastor Theodore was a third-generation Lutheran pastor, Pastor Duane, a fourth generation, and Pastor Mark, a fifth generation of clergyman in the Wuggazer Family.

Pastor Theodore, or "Pastor Ted," attended Fort Wayne Seminary, served at a church in Wyoming, then found a home in the small but faithful halls of Redeemer. In 1940, he earned a Master of Arts Degree from the University of Michigan with his thesis "The History of Protestant Churches in Birmingham, MI." Through the years, Redeemer catapulted at a mighty rate with attendance and ministries both soaring. As a result, Pastor Ted oversaw the building of our church on West Maple, with a forward vision of growth and faithful outreach to the community.

Pastor Ted's wife, Myrtle, was a wonderful compliment to his ministry. She pioneered the first Lutheran Preschool in the area, our beloved Westmaple, which boasts over 100 children in attendance. Myrtle was also invaluable in our Women's and Music Ministries.

As we know, the Lord sometimes allows His most endeared children to face struggling times, and in 1962, Pastor Ted suffered a major heart attack. But after his convalescence, he resumed his vigorous and faithful walk for his congregants. Unexpectantly, on September 22, 1966, after 36-years of faithful service at Redeemer, Pastor Ted finished his lifelong journey for the Lord and was taken home. Upon his passing, we still remember his inspiring words which follow each of us at the end our own journey: "Put away the little things in life, your hopes, your dreams, your ambitions. It's time to come home." We honor him for his untiring efforts and the deep conviction which grew the congregation to over 2,200 souls.

After Pastor Ted's first heart attack in 1962, the congregation asked Pastor Ted's son, Duane to "come home" from his ministry in California to Michigan. That had to be a heart rendering challenge! But Duane loaded up his family and two collies, forsaking the short-sleeved shirts for parkas, and was installed as Assistant Pastor. Duane had always wanted to be a pastor. His mother, Myrtle, tells of Duane preaching from his crib when he was supposed to be napping! Duane was ordained in 1959 and was the "first son" of the congregation to become a pastor. It was Pastor Duane's dream to serve alongside his father in ministry, but the dream was bittersweet when after only three years, Duane became Senior Pastor in the wake of his father's unexpected death. Duane inherited the gift of preaching from his dad, but he added a new touch. In the bulletins, he included an

outline of his sermon, which was a great boon for not only the confirmands, but for new and old members alike! Pastor Duane's sermons always spoke to the heart of the congregation addressing their deepest longings with real life applications people could glean from the pulpit.

Pastor Duane led Redeemer through a time of deep sorrow with Pastor Ted's passing, but he carried on, earnestly continuing the vision of his father. From 1966 on, the church continued to grow and thrive under his leadership. The building was bursting at the seams with exciting ministries and a spirit-led staff. It was indeed time for a youth wing and gym to be constructed, and Pastor Duane oversaw the construction of the first of many building projects enlarging the church and its capacity.

Pastor Duane's wife, Brenda, taught both Confirmation classes and at Westmaple, and was involved in many church ministries. She was also a great co-pilot for Pastor Duane.

Pastor Ted's dream was to have a library at Redeemer. In 1971, that became a reality when the church was expanded. The Walther Leagues and the Senior Choir commissioned a local artist to do an oil painting of our beloved Pastor which hangs as a faithful presence in the library today. The Theodore Wuggazer Memorial Library continues today as a resource for our members where Pastor Ted's dream and legacy lives on.

Pastor Duane was not without his own health concerns. In 1968, his eyesight began to fail, requiring several surgeries and treatments. Pastor Duane and the staff, as well as area Pastors, fought through with the strength of the Lord leading the way. During this time, Vicar Allan Mahnke came to serve our congregation and provided assistance to Duane. Michael Warner served as Vicar in 1969 and was also reliable and helpful. After 33-years of faithful service, Pastor Duane retired.

In 1970, Redeemer called Pastor Holger Cattau, as our Pastor of Visitation. Pastor Cattau brought 30-years of experience to many areas of our ministries. He took over the adult education programs, the Grand Group, Evangelism, and Visitation. We cannot thank Pastor Cattau enough for his abiding presence to our congregation.

In 1980, a second son of the congregation began his studies. Kevin Jones attended Concordia, Ann Arbor, and continued at St. Louis Seminary. When Brenda and Duane married, Kevin became Duane's stepson! Kevin was ordained in 1988. Today, Kevin serves as Senior Pastor at Immanuel, Bay City, MI. Kevin was very active in the Youth Group, Kid Kat Kamp, and played guitar at the 8:30am contemporary services.

A third son of the congregation, Steven Smith, entered the Seminary in 1983 and was ordained in 1990. Steve, the son of Eunice and John Smith, and brother of current member Carole Citron, now serves on the staff at Concordia, Mequon, WI.

The Redeemer Foundation/Endowment Fund was established in 1988 to advance the long-term goals of the congregation. Congregants may donate gifts to grant scholarships to Seminary students. Between 1988 and 1999, the foundation provided grants totaling well over \$ 100,000 to over 80 seminary students and helped pay the tuition of our seminarians.

Toby Joeckel was called to Redeemer as Pastor of Bible Study and Youth in 1985, when Bill Meinert retired. He left a lasting impression on the youth and was a large presence to the congregation, warming up to them with his wonderful sense of humor.

Cary Richert joined our Staff as the Minister of Discipleship in 1985. We were so blessed with him in that position for over 15-years. When Cary decided to attend the seminary, our 75th Anniversary Pledge Drive called "The Man, the Mission, and the Addition" supported his studies. Cary was ordained in 2001 and retired in 2017. He was a scholar of Martin Luther and a very caring, devout minister to our congregation and to our Lord.

Pastor "Emeritus" is a title for a Pastor who has retired from active ministry and is recognized for their dedication. Pastor Carl Mehl came to us as a Pastoral Assistant in 1972 and became Pastor Emeritus in 1998. Pastor Milt Schemm preached at Redeemer and was later Pastor Emeritus in the 1980s. Reverend Gordon Light came onboard from Cross of Christ Lutheran Church as a Pastoral Assistant in 1993, later becoming Pastor Emeritus after his illness in 1995. Pastor Duane gained the title in 2000. Pastor Ron Farah, Pastor Emeritus, was called to his Heavenly home on April 21 of this year. How fortunate we have been to have these stellar, spiritual men retire here at Redeemer!

Between 2006 and 2008, four young men from our congregation, who were part of our youth group and inspired by youth group director, Mark Wuggazer, entered the seminary and went on to become pastors in the LCMS. Reverend Dr. Geoff Boyle served a congregation in Kansas and is currently at Concordia Seminary, Ft. Wayne, IN, where he is an Assistant Professor of Pastoral Ministry and Missions. Reverend Aaron Richert (son of Reverend Cary and Kathy)

ministers at Grace Lutheran in Albuquerque, NM. Reverend C.J. Luttinen is the Senior Pastor at Risen Savior in Wichita, KS, and Reverend Mark Bushuiakovish (son of Carl and Leanna) is the pastor at Our Savior Lutheran Church and Academy in Nashville, TN. Chad Speller also attended the Seminary and was ordained in 2010, and Freeland Goddard began his seminary work, but later suspended his studies.

The last in this group of six seminarians is our own fifth- generation Wuggazer, Mark. After a career in radio broadcasting, Mark heeded the call of the Holy Spirit and attended St. Louis Seminary. In 2009, Mark was ordained at Redeemer, with his father Duane as the ordaining minister, and accepted the call to Redeemer as Youth Minister. Mark continued to lead the youth group to new heights and was instrumental in the success of the Mexicali Mission Trips. As a boy, he had been a kamper and was found to be a great leader as Counselor, and Kamp Director at Kid Kat Kamp for many years.

One of Mark's favorite programs was the creation of the "Redemption" worship service. Once our gym was properly outfitted with a stage and great sound system as part of our Phase 1 remodel, "Redemption" was born. This series of Wednesday night contemporary worship services was especially tailored to the next generation Confirmation group. There was a rock band and contemporary sermons by Pastor Mark focused to the youth audience. He also has the gift of preaching! We are so excited to have Mark back at Redeemer to preach on June 1 as part of our 100th Anniversary hallmark event!

In 2017, Pastor Tyler Walworth joined our staff as Assistant Pastor. He had been the pastor at Our Savior Lutheran Church of the Deaf which worshipped in our Chapel. In 2021, Pastor Walworth and his congregation moved to Beverly Hills, and Pastor Walworth is now at Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Dearborn, MI.

This brings us to our current Pastors! Our fifth senior pastor in 100 -years, Reverend Randy Schlak accepted the call to Redeemer in 1998 and became the Senior Pastor upon Pastor Duane's retirement in 1999. Pastor Randy came from a smaller church - St. John's in Matoon, IL. With his lively sense of humor and tendency to tease those around him, it was easy to see why he was loved by Pastor Duane and others. Pastor Randy brought some levity to what a very serious and weighty atmosphere could be. He studied well under Pastor Duane who also had an open mind and a lively sense of life. He continues to guide us with his gift of Biblical wisdom. Pastor Randy has also been instrumental in greatly expanding our local, national, and international mission work. A plethora of mission trips helped rebuild and restore communities after hurricanes and floods, and feed and clothe people in impoverished countries. Randy also steered our Sacred Space I and II expansions, creating the Town Square, expanding lower-level classrooms, enlarging the sanctuary, and more. His phrase "That All May Find a Space at His Table" will continue to guide us into the future. For 26-years and counting, Pastor Randy has been a true gift to our congregation by guiding us spiritually and looking toward the future needs of our church.

Pastor Randy is joined by his wife, Andrea, who is also a prominent presence in the Sanctuary and halls of Redeemer. Andrea and Randy attended Concordia Seminary, Ann Arbor together, where Andrea earned her Teaching Degree. She taught Kindergarten at their first church, St. John's. Andrea also took over as Westmaple Director when Bonnie Meisel retired. Currently, Andrea teaches Community Bible Study, is involved quietly in countless ministries throughout the church, and is now directing the exciting yearlong 100 Year Anniversary Celebration! Andrea and Pastor Randy designed and gifted our Seminarians with special pastoral stoles. They contain all the names of Jesus and every name points down, but the name 'Redeemer' points up to remind them of where they came from.

James Greenwalt is another son of the congregation to become a pastor and was ordained in 2022. He was baptized by Pastor Duane! Pastor Jimmy assists Pastor Randy in Bible Studies, Confirmation, and preaching. His easy-going, friendly personality blends well with the staff at Redeemer.

SIX YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF "FAITHFUL FRIENDS -A HEART FOR SENIORS"

Word can travel very fast or very slow throughout the hallowed hallways in a Church of God. For this very reason, the Faithful Friends Ministry Team would like to take you back a few years to the birth of this senior-focused program in 2018, and then on to its current status in this noteworthy 100th Anniversary of Redeemer.

Seven years ago, a longtime member of the congregation felt a calling from the heart to start a ministry for the elderly to connect with those who were homebound or living in care facilities and residences. Sensing the loneliness and isolation these loyal members must feel, the idea was presented to Pastor Randy, and with his blessing, a small committee of Redeemer members was formed. "Faithful Friends - A Heart for Seniors" was on its way ready for "post time". As the Lord would have it, those drawn to the Committee felt personal connections through their own experiences with elderly parents or relatives.

Ideas and activities came easily with an action plan assigning a volunteer Redeemer member as a "Faithful Friend" to a shutin or care facility resident. With God's grace guiding, there was an immediate response of volunteers and seniors interested in the program. Personal visits, phone calls, cards, small gifts, devotionals, and prayers built a strong bond between the "Friends" — a Volunteer and their special Senior. When the Lord opens a window, the breeze of love, care, and a servant's heart gently opens many more.

Today, Faithful Friends graciously boasts over 25 Volunteers befriending nearly 30 Seniors. As the Faithful Friends Ministry grew, opportunities for fellowship, service, personal growth, and exchange of ideas for eldercare emerged. Three or four Educational/Enrichment Resource presentations are held throughout the year, with recent topics including: In Home Elder Care — "Seniors Helping Seniors" presented by Dawn Neally; "Estate Planning and Wills" presented by member David Mammel; and "Long-Term Care and Legal Rights" by member Erin Mortensen. Presentations are taped and online on the Redeemer website. In addition, we are also blessed to have an in-house expert on Eldercare, member Diane Johns. The Faithful Friends Ministry Team sends cards to all our Senior friends every holiday and birthday, plus one-year memorial cards to families of our departed friends.

Our primary mission and goal is to honor every elderly member of our Redeemer congregation with the love, joy, and comfort they deserve. We hope to celebrate many more anniversaries along with our church family, Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. 


