- 1. Do you view the Great Commission as a joy or as a burden? What is the motivation and attitude that we should have as Christians when living out this passage? How can you personally grow in seeing it as a joy?
- 2. What does it look like to be a disciple of Jesus? What does it look like to make disciples, according to the passage? What are the observable ways you are/can be making disciples in your life -- both with nonbelievers and with other believers?
- 3. What things are you already doing that you could make more purposeful for making disciples? Who has God already put in your life that you could disciple, or mentor? Take some time to pray for one another and ask God for opportunities to help someone grow as a disciple of Christ.
- 4. Am I currently taking this Great Commission of Jesus my King seriously? If I really believed and held to this, how would things change? How would my life look different? What would I need to pray for? How do I need to be further equipped?
