

Many years ago we started going to Belize, to a village called Gales Point. We did VBS and built some homes. It was a great mission, Redeemer made a difference in the community, and we received more than we gave. It was a true blessing.

Alex Tyler, who started coming on the mission trip with his parents, continued with the mission after Redeemer stopped going. I am proud of what he has accomplished with the mission we started many years ago. Redeemer continues to financially support his work. In a recent update, Alex explained that what started as building houses has grown into so much more. A high school scholarship fund for children to continue their education has seen 15 graduates with 40 more on the way. With Redeemer's support, they have created teachers, electricians, tour guides, and most of all, given hope through an income stream for young adults to start their families the right way.

We hope this next year to invite people of Redeemer once again go to Belize. More information will be coming on the dates and cost of this trip. Having taken this trip a number of times, I can tell you it is life changing.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

As a kid, I remember my Grandma and Grandpa Diepholz's home with extraordinary joy. Family fun. Great food. A legacy of faith. One of my lasting memories of that house was the table that sat between their twin beds. It contained a lamp, a Bible, a catechism and a hymnal. These were well-worn, as Grandpa read to Grandma every night before they went to sleep! What a treasure these tools of faith are! Let us spend some time this month in the hymnal to help us better understand our life as Christian stewards! To do this, we will use LSB 785 "We Praise You, O God."

*We Praise You, O God, our Redeemer, Creator;
In grateful devotion our tributes we bring.
We lay it before You, and kneel and adore You;
We bless Your holy name, glad praises we sing.*

Stewardship is an act of worship. It flows from the grace and mercy we have received in Jesus! Faithful stewardship can never start with us. Our sinful nature will make us and our desires the center of our worship. Our tributes, our giving and our serving only flow from how the Lord Jesus has given of Himself for our sake! When we have this in clear view, our knees bow and our praises flow freely! All this flows from the Name that has been placed on us in Holy Baptism!

*We worship You, God of our Fathers, we bless You;
Through trial and tempest our guide You have been.
When perils o'ertake us, You will not forsake us,
And with Your help, O Lord, our struggles we win.*

Our stewardship that flows from what God has done for us in Jesus Christ is rooted in history. Passed from one generation to the next, stewards of the Gospel connect God's provision in the past to His continued care in the present.

So often, the struggles we face are self-inflicted. While there are indeed perils that can shake us from outside of ourselves, we are more likely enduring the suffering that comes because of our own choices that are outside the Word and will of God! But even in these situations, the Lord who loves us will never forsake us. When we become selfish, self-serving and self-destructive, the Lord NEVER abandons! The Lord helps us to overcome the struggles in faith and win the victory the steward rejoices in!

*With voices united our praises we offer
And gladly our songs of thanksgiving we raise.
With You, Lord, beside us, Your strong arm will guide us.
To You, our great redeemer, forever be praise!*

Stewardship is more than just an individual thing. There is a corporate nature to our steward life. We see this in the Divine Service. There, stewards of all ages, all economic strata and all languages are joined in the singular task of praise. This stewardship of praise flows from the altar to us, out into the world and then back to the altar!

God's strong arm leads us in this stewardship 24/7. This makes stewardship, in all times and places, a matter of worship. We praise our Redeemer who has entrusted us with this great stewardship of the Gospel which forgives our sins, grants us new life and salvation. And this treasure we freely share for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor!

The Fisherman's Tomb: The True Story of the Vatican's Secret Search by John O'Neill

A Texas oilman. A brilliant female archaeologist. An unknown world underneath the Vatican. In 1939, a team of workers beneath the Vatican unearthed an early Christian grave. This surprising discovery launched a secret quest that would last decades -- a quest to discover the long-lost burial place of the Apostle Peter. From earliest times, Christian tradition held that Peter -- a lowly fisherman from Galilee, whom Christ made leader of his Church -- was executed in Rome by Emperor Nero and buried on Vatican Hill. But his tomb had been lost to history. Now, funded anonymously by a wealthy American, a small army of workers embarked on the dig of a lifetime. The Fisherman's Tomb is a story of the triumph of faith and genius against all odds.

From the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod regarding recent events:

This is sad news for our Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. These awful things happen unfortunately in every church body. I believe our synod handles such horrible actions by those who serve the church body quickly and honestly.

I wanted to share the letter from our synodical president concerning this incident. This is a sad and embarrassing situation for our church body. Lord Have Mercy Upon Us!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What I share with you today weighs heavily on me and upon our whole church. In fact, it's devastating. I'm in shock at the injury of innocent victims, and the shame brought upon our faithful people. Jesus have mercy upon us! This afternoon, the Rev. Michael Mohr appeared before a federal magistrate to hear the charges against him. He did not contest the government's motion to detain him until trial, and a grand jury hearing is expected. The press release from the U.S. Attorney's Office, Eastern District of Missouri, states that hidden camera devices were found at his residence and an additional accusation of lewd behavior with a minor was part of the criminal complaint.

As the press release noted, an accusation does not constitute proof of guilt. Our church body has an ecclesiastical process for conduct unbecoming a minister of the Gospel. These processes will be followed. The duties of the District President for the Central Illinois District have been assumed by the First Vice President Michael Burdick.

If these allegations prove true, they are an unfathomable betrayal of the responsibility and trust placed in the servants of the church by Christ and His people. To commit sexual violence or exploitation against others, especially children, is an unconscionable sin and crime. This has no place in the church. Our Lord has strong words for all who would lead His little ones to stumble (Matt. 18:6). The LCMS will fully cooperate with civil authorities on this matter.

We know that such sins and crimes, as alleged, inflict intense pain and suffering on victims. Christ alone provides the healing, and we turn to Him. I commend those who, in any circumstance, courageously shed light on these crimes and sins. If you or a loved one have something to report in regard to this matter, please contact the FBI St. Louis Office at 314-589-2500.

The LCMS Central Illinois District has established a special resource to receive reports from any individual who may have experienced harm by Michael Mohr: 877-276-1740 or email at districtassistance@cidlcms.org. These channels are being monitored by Ms. Rebekah Wendling, a mental health professional.

There are other pastoral matters to address as this process plays out before us, and I'll do so.

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too" (2 Cor. 1:3-5).







COUNSELING CORNER

What an unusual past few months we have had here at Redeemer. So many (I think last count 9) people called to their heavenly home. Unfortunately, the lion's share of these passings were sudden. Being unprepared for a loved one's passing can be devastating. The comfort that we as believers have in suffering this kind of loss is that the separation from our loved one is only temporary not final. But, when we are in the midst of terrible grief from the sudden departure, somehow many do not find much immediate comfort in that fact. The adjustment period for this kind of loss can be months and beyond.

Research has shown that time does NOT heal all wounds especially the death of a loved one. It's how we handle the loss that will facilitate healing or not.

Grounding one's self in the present, asking yourself "where am I now?", noticing things around you in the room, and calling them out or naming them will help reorient you to the present instead of being stuck in the past trauma of the death experience of the loved one.

Asking yourself "where is my loved one right now?" can help when we realize they are no longer stuck in their death experience but alive, safe and well in heaven. "In grief, we often entangle the past, present, and future. We need to come into the present moment so we're getting our meaning from now...not then." (Finding Meaning the Sixth stage of Grief, David Kessler).

Writing the departed a letter for closure has been shown by research to offer a measure of relief. Especially when the loved one leaves suddenly with so much unsaid, with no closure on many levels. I often suggest that the writer ask God to give their loved one the letter. The letter writing can be as often as needed until one day (as one of my Pathways alum put it) "There was nothing else for me to say, I was done." They reported it helped them greatly. Shred the letters then or not - whatever makes you comfortable.

Finally, please remember that Pathways Grief and Loss Recovery Group is offered throughout the calendar year here at Redeemer. It is being offered now the 3rd Tuesday of every month. The next meeting is St. Patrick's Day! Tuesday March 17 at 1pm in Town Square. The Pathways community is so loving and caring. Please don't suffer alone. Let us help you through this transition.




