Excerpt from "My Life Stories," written by Pastor Ron Farah

**IN LOVING MEMORY** Writing this book has been an extremely fulfilling experience. I have enjoyed thinking and writing about the memories of my life from my childhood years to the present. They have brought to mind the many ways I have been blessed by God. I have been humbled by the way He has chosen to use me in many positive ways whether it 7 was through my work or through my relationships with family and



7 was through my work or through my relationships with family and friends. I have been deeply touched thinking about the way He has blessed me through the people he brought into my life, people who have loved me enriched me and corrected me. It has been good

have loved me, enriched me, and corrected me. It has been good and enlightening to recognize some of my failings and shortcomings – we can never stop working at becoming the kind of person God would like us to be.

As I approached the writing of this last chapter it seemed only right to focus on the most important factor of my life – my faith in Jesus Christ as my Savior and Lord and the effect that faith has had on me. It is so easy to go through life thinking about what YOU want and do not want and what YOU like and do not like. These become, so easily, your priorities in life. But it becomes a problem when what you want and like does not match God's plan for you. Those moments present a challenge, often an unconscious challenge, of trying to determine who should be the God that rules our life. It comes down to two choices. The first choice is my Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit who beautifully and wonderfully reveals Himself to me through His Holy Word. The second choice is to make myself my own god so that I can do what I want and think what I want. To loosely quote the Apostle Paul mankind lives with the ongoing decision of worshiping its true creator or turning its back on that creator and becoming its own god. Too often we do not life the guidance God gives through his Word and choose, therefore, to reject that Word. We have all done it and will continue to do it as long as we live on this earth even though we may recognize it is not the best way to go. We find ways to convince ourselves that the true God is willing to make exceptions that allow us to satisfy our own needs and desires even though those needs and desires may conflict with his Word. Truth be told, some people find that works for them.

But now I must speak about what I believe and what I have discovered in this regard. When
the creature rejects is creator and goes its own way there is a significant chance that it could
lead to dissatisfaction and unhappiness. I have discovered that the challenge of going along
with the Word of God will, in the end, lead to much greater peace and happiness. I have
discovered that accepting God's definition of who I am prepares me for life much better than
me defining for myself who I am. I have discovered that finding my purpose in life through
God and his Word produces much better results over against trying to discover for myself my
purpose in life. I have discovered – sometimes after falling flat on my face – that living my life
according to the goals God laid out for me is so much more fulfilling – though sometimes

Yet, in spite of learning all these things which are good for me, the temptation to be my own God continues to live within me. To once again paraphrase the Apostle Paul, I struggle with the fact that the things I know I should do I don't do and the things I know I should not do I do. How can I even look at myself in the mirror without feeling I have too often failed which -23 can lead to the feeling of being a total failure. Then, Paul adds the words, "But thanks be to

## STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT Stewardship in the Body of Christ

Baseball season is upon us. The southern images of spring training give way to the pageantry of Opening Day. On that day, the hopes and dreams of every major league team, player and fan focus on doing whatever it takes to get to the Fall Classic, the World Series. Baseball is a secular way that so many of us confess that hope "springs" eternal.

With all of this in mind, baseball can also teach us a new perspective about stewardship. Think about the game itself. Baseball is a team sport. The home team faces off against the visitors. Yet while it is a team game, there are repetitive, individual confrontations that take place within the game. The baseball game cannot start without the individual pitcher against the hitter. Once the batted ball is in play, the battle is between the ability of the fielder against the speed of the baserunner. Once there is a runner on base, an attempt to steal a base pits the runner against the catcher. A base hit into the outfield pits the outfielder against a runner trying to score.

Baseball is a team game with many smaller units at play. Without all those smaller units working together and achieving their tasks, the team will lose.

**Romans 12** puts our stewardship of the Gospel in a similar setting. The church is certainly described as a team, if you will.

**Verse 3:** "For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned." This is where the Body of Christ is really seen as a team. No one member of the baseball team can win the game by themselves. In the same way, no one part of the Body of Christ can accomplish stewardship of the Gospel alone. The pastor cannot. The congregational chair cannot. The lead soprano in the choir cannot. But each of these individuals have been added to the local congregation to be built into a team that can win the victory with Jesus.

**Verses 4-5:** *"For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another."* In baseball, the pitcher pitches. The catcher catches. The hitter hits. When a pitcher attempts to hit, the result is usually not very pretty. Catchers often do not excel at running the bases. The hitter usually does not do well when they are sent to the mound to pitch. Every member of the Body of Christ has a unique set of abilities and functions. Not everyone preaches. Not everyone leads. Not everyone sings well. Yet when the congregation assembles together as a team, it can succeed in ways unattainable by the individual.

**Verses 6-8:** *"Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness."* Each member of the team has a role to play. Abilities and opportunities are

entrusted to the individual members of the Body of Christ to be used for the ultimate purpose of stewarding the Gospel for the glory of God and the benefit of the neighbor. The one preaching is no more or less important than the others. The one serving or the one teaching, the leader or the merciful one — all are equally important in the faithful stewardship of all that the Lord has entrusted to the Body of Christ. All this stewardship is for the sake of the other!

A baseball team can have five All-Star pitchers but cannot win if the hitters do not hit. The best lineup in the league will struggle if the pitchers cannot get anyone on the other team out. Pitchers need the defense behind them to play well. Coaches need to lead well. When they all work together, you have a winning baseball team. When the Body of Christ has all its members faithfully stewarding the unique individual talents that have been entrusted to them, the victory goes to Jesus! This is the goal of faithful stewardship! It is all about Jesus!



### POUR OUT TO THE GOD OF HOPE AND BE FILLED

"Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Romans 15:13

The annual National Day of Prayer will be held on Thursday, May 1st, inviting people to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. Our Task Force is a privately funded organization whose purpose is to encourage participation on the National Day of Prayer. ### **MOUNT EVEREST TRAGEDY** A TIME TO LIVE...A TIME TO DIE

May 10, 1996 is the date of the most historic tragedy in Mt. Everest history. Eight climbers died. Lou Kasischke, A Redeemer member and renowned mountain climber, was there. He lived to tell that story!

The setting is climbing the highest mountain in the world. The drama was high when, after six-weeks of climbing, things went wrong near the summit. At this point, Lou was 400 vertical feet from the top, but the crux of his story has much in common with everyday life. This was Lou's struggle with himself when he faced a tough decision and conflicting internal voices about what to do. Lou's story includes uncommon moments that revealed what saved his life. It's a story about the still, small voice of the heart. It's really a love story.

Lou will join us at Redeemer on Sunday afternoon, May 4th at 6:00pm in the Sanctuary to show images and tell his intriguing and moving personal story which is more about being mountainside. It's also about his long aftermath journey to understand his experience, to find meaning in it, to share the role of his Christian faith in his survival, and to serve as an example of how and where to go for the guidance and inner strength needed in hard decision moments.

Lou wrote a book entitled "After the Wind" about his experience and served as a consultant to Universal Pictures for the 2015 feature film, "Everest," that told the tragic story.

A Q&A session will follow Lou's presentation, along with a reception with light refreshments in the Town Square. No charge to attend - no sign-up needed. All are welcome – invite family, friends, and neighbors. Lou suggests middle school age and older.

### **CHILDREN'S MINISTRY OVER THE YEARS**

In 1925, Redeemer's "Official Directory" published the following: "The Sunday School is the Church of Tomorrow. The Savior calls to you! Will you not heed the call? Send your children! Our textbook is the Bible! Our teachers are ready to teach!" "Train up a child in the way he should go; and when he is old, he will not depart from it." - Proverbs 22:6

Since the beginning, the religious training of our children has been an integral part of our church heritage. In 1942, 27 students were enrolled in Redeemer's Sunday School, growing exponentially

to a whopping 110 in 1943. The next seven years saw an accelerated growth in attendance, literally bursting the seams of the church. Lessons were taught in the kitchen, the Lounge, the Sacristies, and any other area available for instruction. By 1950, the need for the addition of the Youth Wing to the main building was overwhelmingly clear. Our Sunday School grew like a butterfly spreading its wings, and a second Sunday morningservice was offered to accommodate the growing number of families with children. Redeemer member, Janet Jung, led the opening second service held in the large room now known as the Chapel.

Vacation Bible School began in 1943. After 82 successful years, can you imagine how many children have been blessed with the stories of Jesus? VBS is still held in June and runs Monday through Friday for a week of smiles and laughter. There have been many exciting and magical themes for VBS, including Island in the Son, Son Castle Faire, and Son Town. Some themes featured space, animals, nature, and all were based on Scripture. Our teachers transform the entire church with themed decorations, Bible lessons, crafts, costumes and plays, and opening and closing ceremonies with VBS songs the kids commit to memory. The days of Ritz crackers and orange drink have been replaced with homemade goodies showcasing the theme. It could not be a more festive outreach event teaching children of the community about the heartfelt love and friendship of Jesus, as depicted in parables and narratives throughout the Bible. And like the mercy and forgiveness of our Lord knows no bounds, the attendance at VBS grew at astounding rates, with over 400+ children scampering throughout the halls. And to emphasize the sheer aspect of grace and giving, as our Lord has taught us to do, volunteers also increased each year to currently over 100 adults and teens.

Our playground was built and dedicated to the memory of Clara Knudsen in 1952. Some of you may remember the infamous but fun "merry-go-round" on the playground. Kids either threw up or were thrown off by the fast, circular motion. Children complained but parents were relieved when too many bloody noses and bruises necessitated its removal!

By 1965, Sunday School attendance towered over 500 and 34 staff members! Sunday School had a Superintendent and a Secretary for each. One wonderful and dedicated Superintendent was Bill Meinert. Soon Bill, or "Mr. M" was hired full-time as our Director of Christian Education. Some may also remember the Reilly's and Grovert's as superintendents and teachers.

Our Christmas celebration would not be complete without the Children's Christmas Pageant. In 1965, the pageant was an amazing production, complete with a creche scene with living characters that represented Christmas around the world. Alice Brown directed children in authentic costumes of 17 foreign lands that sang carols in different languages.



Pastor Duane Wuggazer recognized a need for our children to receive more religious training, and in 1962, the mid-week School of Religion was established. Every Tuesday night from 5:00–7:30pm, kids in grades 3-8 gathered at church. It was a balance of religion and confirmation instruction, combined with music, arts and crafts, and a yummy dinner. In the early 1970s, Mrs. Grovert taught sex education to the seventh graders who studied a book called "Take the High Road!"

In the early 1970s, "Backyard Bible School" was a real treat for the kindergarten kids to get to know Jesus. Held in Tim and Sandy Springer's backyard, Mr. Meinert brought Karen Pridmore and Cathy Stevens to teach Bible stories, play games, do crafts, and music. It was a sort of mini-VBS, and Sandy provided delicious refreshments!

In the late 1970s, high school and college students were brought on as Sunday School teachers. Marilyn Staargaard remembers being asked by Mr. M to be a teacher. With no formal training, she "winged it," and from that point on, she was truly bitten with the teaching "bug!" Mildred Reilly, a very active crusader for children at Redeemer, took on the job of Teacher Trainer, among many other Children's Ministry activities. Our School of Religion and Sunday School boasted at least 35 teachers who participated in educating our children. School of Religion ended in 1995 but left the blessings of life-long friendships among both students and teachers.

When a child is baptized, they are enrolled in "Cradle Roll." Initiated in 1980, Pat Wolfenberg worked tirelessly in this ministry, providing each family with Christian materials to aid parents in raising their infant and toddlers. Our nursery still provides excellent care while parents are in worship services. Kris Leonard now heads up Cradle Roll and is doing a beautiful job!

## **100TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION**

Kitty Sweitzer, another steadfast anchor at Redeemer, became Director of Children's Ministry from 1985 to 2015. Kitty was the mastermind of countless missions and meaningful ministry opportunities. "Beanie Baby Buddy Bags" were sent to New Mexico giving children of battered mothers supplies to comfort and encourage them. Hygiene kits were sent to Africa, along with "Little Dresses and Breeches" for children needing clothing. She created "Birthday Bags" for children in foster care. For our soldiers in Iraq in 2003, "Hugs in a Box" were sent to provide spiritual encouragement, cards, and candy. Miss Kitty has also been a preschool teacher at Westmaple Nursery School since 1979!

"Moms Day Out" opened its doors in 1996 and was a lifesaver for busy moms with little ones. Children were dropped off and cared for by our faithful staff of teachers. From 9:00am to noon, Bible stories, crafts, snacks, and playground time were enjoyed by the children.

In 2002, Dave Sheldon was hired to direct Family Life Ministry. He started a program called "Faith Stepping Stones," recognizing the developmental steps in a child's religious life from the Sacrament of Baptism, Sunday School, and the Rite of Confirmation. Lovingly crafted by Redeemer member Jim Endress, "Faith Chests" are given to each baptized child, and contains a children's Bible and spiritual nurturing prayer books. Our third graders are also presented with their own Adventure Bible each year, allowing for easy Bible reading and is full of study aids to encourage independent study of the Bible.



During the summer months, there are plenty of opportunities for our children to grow in Christ. In 2008, "WowWee Wednesdays" featured a variety of age-related fun for kids in preschool through fifth grade. "Clay Play," "Christmas in July," and "Cooking with Donna" were the programs that year. "Scamper Camp" runs three days a week for sessions of 3-weeks at a time. Another "raised at Redeemer staff member" Nicole Olds, Director of Children's Ministry since 2015, plans amazing adventures such as dinosaur digs and zoo explorations for our little ones.

During Lent, "Lenten Kidz" is a special program that helps children understand Jesus' path to the Cross. Crafts and Bible lessons are taught during Wednesday Lenten services while parents worship in the Sanctuary.

Redeemer has a long-standing history of providing many ways for parents to bring their children into the faith. It has been an incredible thing to watch our children's programs grow over the years, giving a loud voice to the importance of those beautiful words from Mark.

For the Chinese people, society's rules about what is good and bad were about what is good and bad were were reversed, first when the Communists conquered China in 1949, and then the reversal was emphasized seventeen years later, when the Cultural Revolution began. The result was that families who, before Communism, had worked hard and intelligently and had prospered suddenly became national enemies. Even those who had chosen not to flee China. out of a strong sense of Chinese patriotism, like the author's parents and grandparents, were declared by the state to be "enemies of the people". Even worse, no way was allowed for such a family to "make up" for its past, and even the children who were born into Communism. like the author and her siblings and friends, were declared to be guilty of the "crimes" of their ancestors. Agonizing choices, sacrifice, fear and reprisal underscore this story of passage. We will be waiting for you in the Town Square!




