As We Gather

The custom of commemorating all the martyrs of the church on a single day dates back to at least the third century. Today, All Saints' Day commemorates all the people of God (living or departed) who comprise the Body of Christ, Our Lord's Church both in heaven and on earth. God has knit together His chosen people; people who would often be the first to admit they neither look nor act as saints, into one holy communion of believers united in the mystical Body of Jesus Christ. Here we join with the angels, archangels and all the company of heaven in singing an unending hymn of praise and thanksgiving to the Lamb who was slain for the sins of the world, and who is now seated at the right hand of the heavenly Father.
