It was way back in the Old Testament, before the kings ruled Israel, the Judges ruled. It was a time when Israel was struggling, and everyone was doing what seemed right in their own eyes. God reached down and chose a woman of great faith. Her name was Deborah.



Deborah was a prophetess, God spoke to her and she relayed His word to the people. As a judge she ruled and Parta Rusy individuals core to the individuals came to her to settle their disputes.



Her best known faith example is when the Israelites cried out to God for relief after 20 years of oppression from the king of Canaan. King Jabin had 900 iron chariots and ruled in northern Israel. Deborah lived in the south just outside Jerusalem. She summoned Barak a commander from the tribe of Naphtall. When he arrived, Deborah gave to him God's plan:

She sent for Barak son of Abinoam from Kedesh in Naphtali and said to him, "The Lord, the God of Israel, commands you: 'Go, take with you ten thousand men of Naphtali and Zebulun and lead them up to Mount Tabor. I

> will lead Sisera, the commander of Jabin's army, with his chariots and his troops to the Kishon River and give him into your

hands.'" (Judges 4:6-7)

Barak was hesitant to go so insisted Deborah to go with him. She agreed but told Barak he would now loose the honor of capturing Sisera, and now the honor would go to a woman.

God would bring them a great victory through a torrential downpour that flooded the Kishon River leaving the king helpless, and his chariots stuck in mud. continued on page 15

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT

MORE THAN A NEGATIVE

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without technically lying. You tell just enough of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing how close we can get to sinning without technically going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just





as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.

The king would escape but was done in by another woman, Jael, who drove a tent stake through his head and killed him.

Deborah is the only woman mentioned in the Bible who both ruled Israel and gave military orders to a man! We are not told any name of her children, if she had any. But in Judges 5:7 she refers to herself as "a mother in Israel".

We believe that she says this of herself for she became the nation's caretaker or as the New English Translation puts it, "a mother protector in Israel."

Other translations:

"The mighty men in Israel failed, they failed until Debbora arose, until she arose a mother in Israel" (LXX).

"The villages in Israel were no more, they were no more until you arose, O Deborah, until you arose, mother of Israel!" (NJB). "There were few people left in the villages of Israel — until Deborah arose as a mother for Israel" (NLT). "Deliverance ceased, Ceased in Israel, Till you arose, O Deborah, Arose, O mother, in Israel!" (TNK).





This month we'll take a look back at the Children's Ministry of Redeemer

"Recognizing the need for a stronger religious foundation for our children, Redeemer congregation will initiate a new phase of its program on September 17. 1963. This is a School of Religion (SOR) for children of school grades 3-8."

Every Tuesday night, you would find Redeemer packed with children and adults. School of Religion ran from 5-8 pm, and included Chapel, dinner, religious instruction and confirmation, choirs, and art.

Over 200 women from the different guilds cooked and served the dinners – sloppy joes, spaghetti, hot dogs, and more. According to news articles, this was a brand-new concept in the LCMS, and the files contain many letters from

churches around the country asking for information. A letter to the congregation from Pastor Duane explains the curriculum and objectives. He notes: "I have never seen a congregation, as a whole, respond so enthusiastically to a single program of the church as they have to this one. We have been practically knocked off our feet by the tremendous enrollment this first year. This is the best thing that ever hit this place!" The total enrollment for the first year was 237 students, taught by 12 teachers in 12 classrooms. In 1983, the total staff was 34! SOR ran two choirs — The Chorister Choir (grades 1-3) Directed by Sue Sack, and the Crusader Choir (grades 4-8) Directed by Gene Guettler, Lee Barton, and Mike Dundas.

SOR was discontinued in 1995, due to low enrollment.




