As We Gather

The name for Maundy Thursday comes from the Latin word “mandatum,” which means “commandment.” It refers to the two new commandments our Lord gave to His disciples on this day: “Love one another,” and “Do this in remembrance of me.” In the early Christian Church, Maundy Thursday was also the day on which those who had fallen away from the Church were restored to full fellowship with other believers after having observed the 40-day penitential time of Lent.

In his Small Catechism Martin Luther asks: “What is the benefit of eating and drinking in the Sacrament of the Altar?” Luther’s answer: these words, “Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins,” shows us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given to us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation. Today’s service focuses on these gracious gifts of God freely given in the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

This evening, the confirmands will sit together as a class and assist in stripping the altar. This is a meaningful way for our young people to participate in the worship and service of God.

Prayer Before Worship

My Lord Christ, I have fallen, I would gladly be strong. For this purpose You have instituted the Sacrament, that with it we may rekindle and strengthen our faith and be helped. Therefore I am to receive it. Behold, Lord, it is Your Word. My weakness and failings are known to You. You Yourself have said: “Come unto me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.” I now come to be helped. Amen.

The Words of Institution

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, “Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me.” After the same manner also He took the cup when He had supped, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, “Drink ye all of it; this cup is the New Testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the remission of sins. This do, as often as ye drink it, in remembrance of Me.”

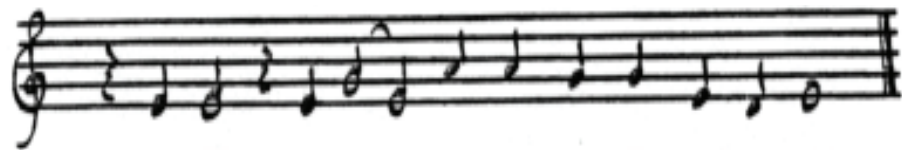
PSALM 22 (Sung during the stripping of the altar)

(Psalm 22 is known as the "Psalm of the Cross". The Psalm begins with Jesus' words from the Cross, "My God, my God, why have You forsaken me?" and ends with "For He has done it" bringing to mind the words of Jesus on the Cross, "It is finished.")

We leave, but our worship is not over. Tomorrow, we will continue our worship as we reassemble to follow our Lord to the Cross.)

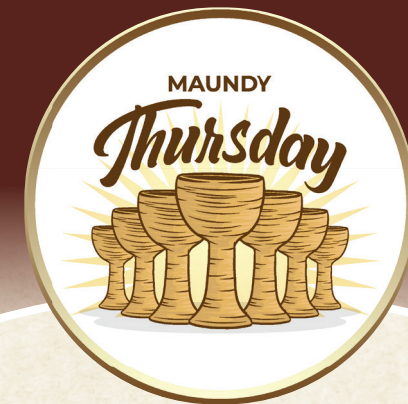
